ALONETTE

Alonette charms with tenderness, letting her confessional songs and odes to day-to-day existentialism flow with an ease reminiscent of a child's fantasy play. She conjures heartfelt folk-pop with a nod-to-the '70s, her voice carrying echoes of Karen Carpenter's crystalline demeanour and Joni Mitchell's vulnerability. Yet her music doesn't shy away from experimentation, creating songs full of unexpected twists and bittersweet sentimentality—establishing herself as an Estonian counterpart to Jessica Pratt and Aldous Harding. Acoustic guitar, strings, and soft-footed electronic sounds embrace each other empathetically.

In March 2025, Alonette released her debut album *Compass*, praised for its maturity, rich sonority, and ability to balance vulnerability with wit.

DUO RUUT

Duo Ruut represents the harmonious collision of two close friends whose vastly different musical backgrounds have forged an extraordinary creative partnership. Drawing inspiration from their ancestral heritage, they share a single kannel—transforming this traditional Estonian zither into their blank canvas for pioneering new playing techniques. Working with runo song texts, their music achieves glistening minimalism whilst maintaining crossover appeal. The duo's voices shift seamlessly from sweet to sharp, creating dynamic tension within deceptively simple arrangements.

This approach has captured global attention, earning them spots at Glastonbury and Roskilde. June 2025 brought their album *Ilmateade*, which reached BBC airwayes and earned recognition as The Guardian's folk album of the month.

NIGHT TAPES

Night Tapes started out as night jams between house-mates Max Doohan, Sam Richards and Iiris Vesik in London. A creature of the night, an idea born from the intoxicating rush between strobes and streetlights. A splash of neopsychedelia, a few drops of downtempo and carefully sprinkled R'n'B vibes make the Night Tapes' recipe on their latest output assisted memories (2024) a trip without a return ticket

Their 2024 highlights include winning the Best Indie/Alternative Album title for perfect kindness EP at the inaugural Estonian Music Awards, release of fourth EP assisted memories, nomination for the coveted Music Moves Europe Awards and the successful US headline tour. The band is currently working on their long-waited debut full-length.

Dream pop outfit mariin k. are carving out their own space in the shoegaze revival, led by Mariin Kallikorm's vision of yearning soundscapes wrapped in cascading reverb. Kallikorm brings serious credentials, having toured internationally with trip-hop pioneer Tricky and as part of London-based indie project Wyldest. Their debut album rose skin, released in May 2025 via Seksound, earned a spot on Seattle's influential KEXP and praise from Darla Records.

What sets them apart is their commitment to strong songwriting within the genre's atmospheric framework. Kallikorm and guitarist Paul Sild synchronise tremolo-drenched dream pop with jangle pop's melodic clarity, exploring love, self-discovery, and vulnerability with both ethereal beauty and emotional substance.

PRIDIAN

Pridian emerged in 2022 as Estonia's most promising metalcore export. What began as four musicians exploring heavy music has rapidly evolved into a cinematic metal project that prioritises storytelling as much as sonic brutality. The band weaves futuristic industrial soundscapes with atmospheric textures and narrative-driven concepts.

Their debut EP *Cybergnosis* (2023) established them as rising stars whilst catching international attention with its marriage of crushing riffs and catchy hooks. The breakthrough came in 2024 when Century Media Records signed them. The band's full-length debut *Venetian Dark* (May 2025) showcases wide-ranging influences whilst maintaining subtle technicality-modern metalcore that carves out distinctive territory.



TALLINN MUSIC WEEK

Held annually in Tallinn, Estonia since 2009, Tallinn Music Week (TMW) is one of the most acclaimed new music discovery festivals and key networking events for music and creative industry professionals across Europe. TMW's music programme is renowned for its bold mix of unique talent with diverse genres from experimental electronica to contemporary classical, presented to an audience of around 20,000 festivalgoers and over 1,000 industry professionals. The TMW conference addresses music-related topics from practical workshops to inspiring pop-culturology talks and cross-sectoral future visions. The next edition of TMW is scheduled to take place on 9-12 April 2026.

Run by companies Muusikanädal and Shiftworks, TMW is a co-founder of The Federation of International Music Conferences (FoMC), and a member of the European Talent Exchange, Keychange and the European showcase platform for global music UPBEAT.


